Public Health Nurse (PHN) high risk and postpartum care case management services for pregnant and parenting women.

Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program (CPSP)

In collaboration with Valley Health Clinic (SCMVC) Services. High Risk Infants These are women that have given birth at VMC and St Louise only. Must have participated in 3 CPSP visits during their pregnancy to qualify. They can be high risk antepartum clients. The clients are seen up to 4 home visits within 60 days after delivery.

High risk infants: These are infants that have been discharged from the VMC NICU only. The PHN can work with the families up to 6 months or longer if needed.

High risk infants/children: These are infants that are referred from VMC clinic, Urgent Care and ER. The PHN can keep these clients open up to 6 months if needed.

First 5 PHN Home Visitation.

Referrals come from Department of Family and Children Services.

Eligibility: Children 0-5 years of age, an open CPS (Child Protective Services) case, or parents involved in Dependency Wellness Court. Families are seen for up to 6 months.

Nurse Family Partnership

Eligibility: Pregnant first-time mothers of any age residing in Santa Clara County. Client must be referred before the 28th week of pregnancy and meet low-income criteria..

Services: Intensive home visitation provided by a Public Health Nurse. Goals of the program include: 1) Improving pregnancy outcomes, 2) Improving child health and development, and 3) Improving the economic self-sufficiency of the family.
